The POC Net Zero Group has pulled together **TEN EASY STEPS** to enable you to drive change within the office. We have already observed a 1 degree change in the Earth's temperature and realistically need to keep this below 1.5 degrees. We can contribute by reducing our carbon footprint starting with ten easy steps.

Use a green energy provider – Renewable energy is cheaper and better for the environment, with tax relief/ exemptions available. Invest in solar energy and get your power from the sun!

- 2. Introduce energy saving initiatives Install smart meters to track energy usage, use energy saving devices such as timer systems to control heating, lighting, appliances, recycle old office appliances replace with energy efficient ones. Use natural light where possible and install LED (energy efficient) lighting (consider Light as a Service). Encourage employees to take the train, walk or even cycle instead of the car.
- 3. Multi-use, not single-use Use multi-use items e.g. crockery/cutlery/refillable print cartridges/rechargeable batteries/soap bars or refillable hand soap. Buy supplies in bulk and store in large containers.
- 4. Think before you print Save energy/paper/ink. If you do have to print, edit and re-proof documents online, then make double-sided copies. Re-use old single-sided copies as scrap paper.
- 5. Use recycled/recyclable, where possible Use recycled paper/recycled plastic/second hand office furniture, reconditioned computers. Encourage reuse of supplies such as old binders/folders, rubber bands, paper clips, envelopes and packaging materials. Shred old paper and use for packaging.
- Reduce your use of harmful chemicals Use vegetable ink cartridges/eco-friendly cleaning products.
- 7. Manage your waste & recycle Identify what needs recycling (think food, office paper, cardboard, glass, tins and cans, single-use plastics, flexible plastics, cartons, coffee cups, coffee grounds, compostable packaging and coat hangers) and provide labelled bins. Companies such as The First Mile (www.thefirstmile.co.uk) will collect and sort mixed recycling and general waste (ensuring zero-to-landfill), or use Terracycle (www.terracycle.com) to recycle those hard to recycle items.
- 8. Consider your Technology Choose re-conditioned, rather than new computers, phone systems and mobiles. Buy laptops (use less energy) rather than desktops, or use smaller screens. Remind employees to use hibernation/ sleep mode when they step away from their desks and to turn equipment off at the end of the day.

- Streamline your approvals processes Reduce the requirement for product samples within the approvals process., This one, simple action will reduce waste throughout your supply chain.
- 10. Get your employees on board You need to communicate how, by implementing these small changes, everyone can make a difference. Celebrate your successes and share progress made towards your more efficient and environmentally friendly office!
